China and America: the new geopolitical equation
In the last 15 years, China has implemented a wide-ranging
strategy of economic outreach and expansion of all its national capacities, including military and diplomatic capacities. Where the United States has taken a step back from
multilateral trade agreements and discarded the TransPacific Partnership (TPP), China has made inroads through
efforts like the Belt and Road Initiative and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). What are Beijing's
geopolitical objectives? What leadership and political conditions in each society underlie growing Sino-American
tensions? What policies might Washington adopt to address this circumstance?

CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL NO. 169
GENDER EQUITY IN EDUCATION: TITLE IX CODIFICATION
AUTHORED BY SENATORS JACKSON AND DE LEON
SUPPORTED BY AAUW CA

PASSED SENATE AND ASSEMBLY-PRESENTED TO GOVERNOR SETPEMBER 20, 2017, VETOED BY GOVERNOR OCTOBER 15, 2017. CURRENTLY PENDING IN SENATE. CONSIDERATION OF GOVERNOR'S VETO PENDING.

Senate Floor Pass – 28 Ayes to 10 Noes, Assembly Floor Pass – 61 Ayes to 12 Noes

Existing federal law, known as Title IX, prohibits a person, on the basis of sex, from being excluded from participation in, being denied the benefits of, or being subject to discrimination, which includes sexual harassment, under any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. Based on federal regulations, this bill would define "sexual harassment" to include "sexual violence," as defined, for the purposes of those state laws. The bill would, among other things, require the appropriate governing board or body of each elementary and secondary school that receives state financial assistance, and the appropriate governing board or body of each higher education institution that receives state funds for student financial assistance, to, as a condition of receiving that financial assistance, comply with certain requirements, based on federal regulations. (Based on text date 9/18/2017)

Governor Brown vetoed SB 169, which would have codified Title IX federal law and regulation into California law. This is of great concern to AAUW CA given the importance of Title IX in our organization, especially since Education Secretary Betsy De Vos has very recently systematically done away with many of the enforcement tools I the federal regulations. In his veto statement, Governor Brown commented, "I am not prepared to codify additional requirements in reaction to a shifting federal landscape." He further stated, "I strongly believe that additional reflection and investment of time in understanding what is happening...will help us exercise due care in this complex arena, I intend to convene a group of knowledgeable persons who can help us chart the way forward." **AAUW CA will be watching!!**
