PUBLIC POLICY

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

AAUW CA supports **Assembly Bill 1803** introduced by Assembly Member Choi. An act to add Section 69503.5 to the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education.

SUMMARY: The bill requires a public or private institution of higher education that offers a baccalaureate degree program, provides career placement and job search services to students, and receives state funds for student financial assistance to provide career placement and job search services to graduates for five years after they have received a baccalaureate degree at the institution. The institution is to provide these services at no cost to graduates. The outcome expected if this bill passes is that recent graduates will be able to get the resources they need to be better equipped for their job search. It is also anticipated the number of low-income students using these services to increase due to these services being made free for a period of time following graduation.

FISCAL EFFECT: This program is not reimbursable by the State.

- Ongoing annual General Fund costs to California State University (CSU) campuses of approximately \$3.2 million to support additional staff and one-time General Fund costs of approximately \$350,000 for materials and staff training.
- Ongoing annual General Fund costs to the University of California (UC) campuses of roughly \$2.5 million to support additional staff and revise and expand existing contracts with vendors providing career services (for example, online career resources).
- The CCC baccalaureate degree pilot program began in fall 2016 and is to sunset July 1, 2023 and it is unclear whether CCCs will grant bachelor degrees.
- Unknown costs to private institutions.
