
PRESIDENT'S CORNER


Contribute to the Cause!

Spotlight on Women in Elected Office


PERCENTAGE OF WOMEN IN CONGRESS



While women remain underrepresented in Congress, their numbers have risen steadily over the past half-century.

When the new Congress convened in January, nearly a quarter of its voting membership was comprised of women — the highest percentage ever. And women now hold roughly 28 percent of state executive positions. While women remain underrepresented in business, government and nonprofits, this progress is worth celebrating. Having diverse new voices in policymaking will matter as AAUW embarks on an ambitious agenda to advance equity laws, including the Paycheck Fairness Act.

All Members of Congress: Women of Color 8.8% All Others 91.2% Women in Congress: Women of Color 37% Other Women 63%

Congress is still not nearly as diverse as the country it represents, but women of color are making inroads, comprising 37% of female members and nearly 9% of all members.
